- 1. The relevance of the robustness and transparency of The Good Living Score criteria
- 2. An analysis of the weightings applied to all The Good Living Score criteria
- 3. An analysis of the choice of internal and external stakeholders
- 4. An overall comparison of the system with the standards recommendations*
- 5. An analysis of the various stages in the use of the system by different users
- 6. A documentation review
- 7. The reliability of the data consolidation system
- 8. The detailed tests carried out by sampling primary/source information on the implementation and operation of the processes for collecting, reporting, compiling, processing, and controlling information.
